

Rear Admiral Fitzhugh Lee

RADM Fitzhugh Lee, descendent of a long line of American Fighting men, was born in the Philippine Islands, August 19, 1905. His father, George Mason Lee, was a Colonel in the U.S. Army. His grandfather was a General in the Confederate and U.S. Army. His great-grandfather was a brother of General Robert E. Lee, and an Admiral in the Confederate and U.S. Navies. His great-grandfather was Henry (Light Horse Harry) of Revolutionary Fame.

Admiral Lee attended schools in the Philippine Islands, United States, and France prior to his appointment to the U.S. Naval Academy by President Harding in 1922.

Carrier Division Fourteen is commanded by RADM FITZHUGH LEE, U.S.N. The Commander's staff consists of nine officers and 39 enlisted men who assist the Commander in carrying out the Flag's primary mission — Hunter-Killer training. The Commander's Senior Aide is CAPT E. C. LONG, Chief of Staff. LCDR A. S. TADDEO is Admiral Lee's Flag Secretary, and LT J. E. diPRE-TORO, Jr., is Flag Lieutenant. Other assistants to the Flag Officer include a Staff Operations Officer, three assistant operations officers, a Communciations Officer, and an Officer of Logistics and Intelligence. Enlisted personnel on the Commander's staff include Boatswain's Mates, Quartermasters, Yeomen, Radiomen, Telemen, an Engineman, and a Journalist.

Carrier Division Fourteen is composed of the USS WRIGHT, USS MONTE-REY, USS SAIPAN, and the USS ANTIETAM.
