

Originally from Bangor, Maine, Cdr. Orbeton attended the University of Maine and the United States Naval Academy, becoming a commissioned officer in June 1944. He is also a graduate of U.S. Naval Intelligence School, Anacosta, Maryland. Cdr. Orbeton saw his first sea duty aboard the USS Winslow (DD-359), and has subsequently served in the USS Power (DD-839); USS Little Rock (CL-92); USS Hobson (DMS-26); USS Macon (CA-92); as Commanding Officer, USS Impervious (MSO-449); and as Executive Officer of the USS Rooks (DD-809), and the USS Calvert (APA-32).

Tours of shore duty have included the Bureau of Naval Personnel, the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations, as an Assistant Naval Attache in Rome, and as Head, Education and Intelligence Departments of the US Naval Amphibious School, Coronado.
